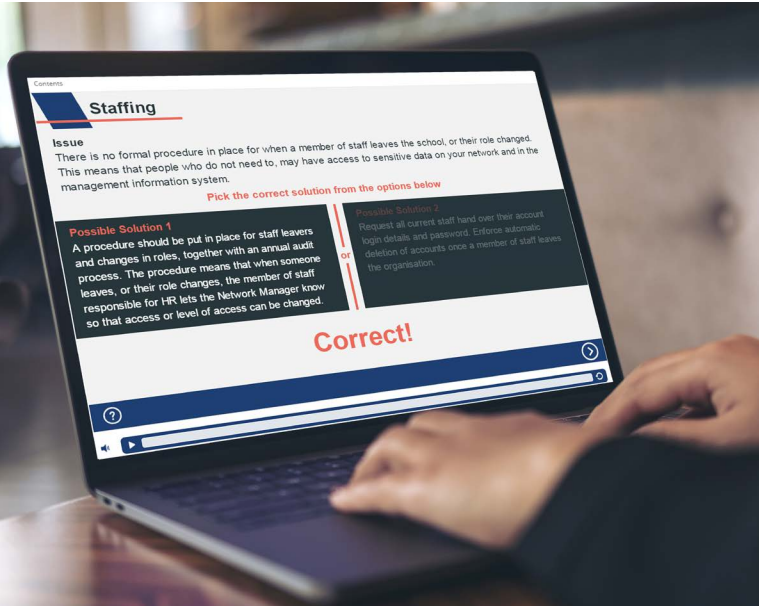


A Practical Guide to the GDPR for Education
