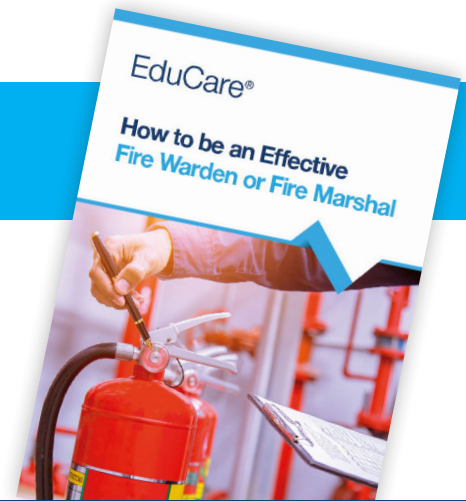


How to be an Effective Fire Warden or Fire Marshal
