


Infection Prevention and Control in Health and Social Care



- Outbreaks of infections.



Bacteria

Clostridium difficile (C. diff)

This is an infection affecting the bowel. It is caused by the bacteria by which it is known, Clostridium difficile. C. diff can be life threatening for some, more vulnerable individuals.

Signs and symptoms

- Diarrhoea
- Abdominal (tummy) pain
- Blood in the faeces
- High temperature
- Loss of appetite
- Feeling sick


