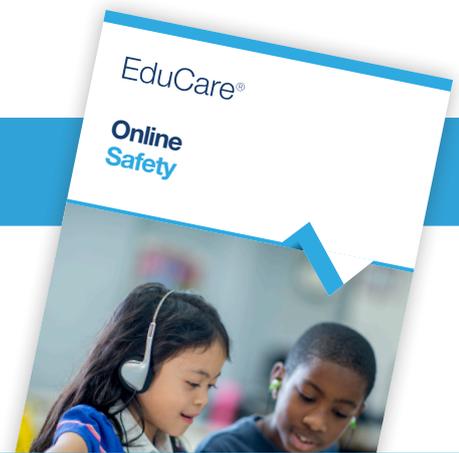


Online Safety
